

Summary

The goal of this program is to encourage Agricultural Education Teachers to continue in the profession and help bolster Agriculture Education in Illinois.

Upon successful annual re-application, Agricultural Education teachers who were accepted into the program will receive increased grant awards receiving \$10,000 in total. *Recipients are responsible for reporting the income.*

After Year 3	\$2,000

After Year 5	\$3,000

Continued Program Eligibility

Once admitted, awardees are eligible for an increased grant for the next four years. Criteria for continued eligibility include:

- Must maintain traditional teaching license (Professional Educator License-PEL)
- Must be teaching full-time with a minimum of 50% agriculture related courses and activities, and must have a contract to teach for the following school year at a school in Illinois
- Must maintain an IAVAT membership
- Must show continued growth and success addressing short and long-term personal and professional goals
- Must complete the re-application process

Timeline

- Renewing teachers will receive a re-application link each April and will be reviewed based on the above criteria.
- Successful re-applicants receive funding in August
